2025 YEAR IN REVIEW



FEDERAL EFFORTS

Preserved Medicaid Supplemental Funding for Texas – DHR Health’s advocacy and strong relationships at the federal level helped prevent proposals that would have put the State of Texas in a similar position as Medicaid expansion states in terms of funding cuts. DHR Health receives more than \$100 million annually in Medicaid supplemental payments. There were many proposals in Congress that aimed to severely cut these payments to all states, Texas included. DHR Health worked with members across the Texas delegation to communicate and champion the importance of Medicaid supplemental payment programs to Texas hospitals, the Texas economy, and the health care safety net. The final passage of President Trump’s One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA) did include a freeze and some reductions to Texas Medicaid supplemental payments; however, these reductions are much smaller than proposed, gradual, and do not take effect until 2028, providing time for hospitals to continue fighting.

Prevented Catastrophic Provision from Being Adopted in the U.S. Senate – In the early morning hours of the final day, the Senate released final language to be voted on which would have (unintendedly) cut \$1 billion in annual Medicaid supplemental payments to the State of Texas. DHR Health worked aggressively, including speaking to our senators directly while they were on the Senate floor, about the need to change the language. The ultimate language adopted was changed to prevent catastrophic funding cuts to the State of Texas.

Pushed Back on 340B Repayment Proposal – DHR Health successfully advocated to Congress and CMS to prevent the agency from adopting an ill-thought-out proposal. For years, CMS erroneously cut funding to 340B hospitals. After a Supreme Court ruling, CMS had no choice but to pay those hospitals what it owed. However, in order to pay for its own mistake, CMS adopted a policy to cut all hospital outpatient department payments by 0.5%. In 2025, CMS proposed to increase this cut to 2%. DHR Health fought to prevent this proposal from taking effect and was successful.

STATE EFFORTS



Secured Research Facility Funding – DHR Health successfully secured a \$15 million appropriation to the University of Houston (UH) for the purpose of partnering with DHR Health and the DHR Health Institute for Research and Development on the construction of a new state-of-the-art research facility on the DHR Health South Campus.

Behavioral Hospital Bed Funding – In 2023 (88th Legislature), DHR Health secured \$85 million in funding for a 100-bed behavioral hospital in the Rio Grande Valley; we were later awarded the grant by the Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC). In 2025 (89th Legislature), DHR Health's advocacy team successfully lobbied against a proposal that would have funded these 100 beds at a daily rate of around \$500. The final budget for the 2026-2027 biennium included a daily rate of \$770, ensuring that the 100 state beds at the new DHR Health Behavioral Hospital are funded at a sustainable rate.

Preserving Graduate Medical Education Funding for the Future – DHR Health led the charge and successfully defeated a legislative proposal that would have prioritized state GME grant funding for state-run medical schools and health-related institutions. DHR Health built a coalition of hospitals and presented irrefutable evidence of the damage the proposal would do to GME programs across the state. Our advocacy efforts ensured DHR Health is able to continue receiving \$2.4 million in GME grants annually, as well as maintain eligibility for additional millions of dollars in future applications.

SB 1467 Death Registry Legislation – DHR Health was successful in passing SB 1467, which allows the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) to share death information of patients with Texas hospitals. Prior to passage of SB 1467, hospitals were dinged by quality programs because of lack of data.

State Health Care Budget – Working with the hospital industry, DHR Health advocacy efforts helped ensure that the 2026-2027 biennium budget for the State of Texas fully funded Medicaid and hospital payments (including trauma) with a substantial increase in funding for rural health care, the health care workforce, and graduate medical education.

The Dementia Prevention & Research Institute of Texas (DPRIT) – In the 89th Texas Legislature, DHR Health lent its advocacy efforts and voice to a chorus of stakeholders and legislators working to fund and establish efforts to research the cause of dementia. The Rio Grande Valley suffers from some of the highest rates of dementia and Alzheimer's in the nation.

Defeat of a Slew of Anti-Hospital Legislation – In the 89th Texas Legislature, DHR Health fought on the front lines with various stakeholders, associations, and hospital industry advocacy teams to defeat a slew of bad legislation that would have negatively impacted DHR Health. Proposals included a ban on facility fees, which would have reduced revenue by around \$15 million annually; unnecessary red tape and duplicative billing requirements; limits on charity care; and new, overly broad liability for hospitals, including in the administration of vaccines.

LOCAL EFFORTS



City of Brownsville Economic Incentives – DHR Health secured \$2 million in economic incentives from the City of Brownsville, to expand services at DHR Health Brownsville, including building a heart catheterization lab, expanding the Emergency Department, expanding the Radiology Department, and purchasing new imaging equipment.

City of McAllen 380 Agreement Commitment – DHR Health secured a commitment from the City of McAllen for \$2 million in economic incentives to reimburse DHR Health for the purchase of equipment to be placed in the state-of-the-art research facility to be built on the DHR Health South Campus. The text of the agreement is still being worked out.

In 2025, Border Health PAC consisted of more than 321 members who collectively contributed \$1.15 million in support of BHPAC programs. During the year, the PAC disbursed \$767,200 to a broad range of federal, state, and local candidates, as well as to organizations whose work aligns with its mission.

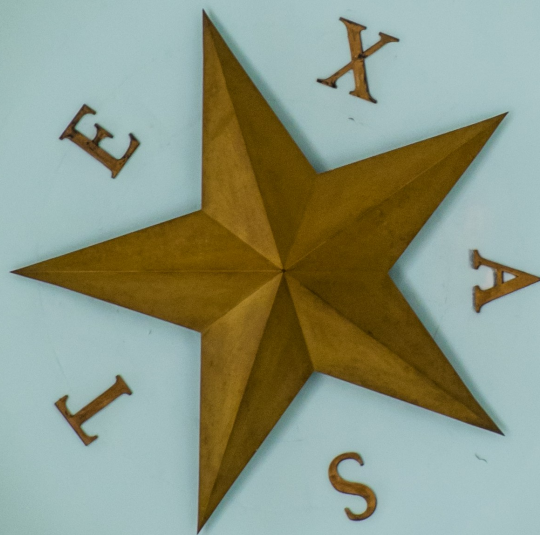
